- OASIS Housing committee will participate in an advisory group capacity









Two recent outputs / outcomes of the working group

 - ii. Housing is a critical factor in the health and well being of people.











Why

- 1. Housing crisis is real
- 2. 18% of people in shelters have a dd
- 3. 52k on the provincial waitlist
 - a.29k of which are wanting something that meets their housing needs.
- 4. 50% of people with DD live with a significant medical issue
- 5. Women with a DD are 65% more likely to experience abuse





- Goals of this paper (a sample of)
 - a. Identify what zoning is and is not
 - i. Land use. Not building code or fire code
 - i. What can go where
 - ii. Site design. Parking, setbacks, height, use
 - b.Identify best practices
 - c.Advocate for policy change
 - d.Make specific recommendations
 - e.Support informed decision making
 - f.Promote collaboration






- Looked at 18 municipalities
- Regulations and Definitions Differ your community is unique
 - Occupancy limits
 - Dwelling Types
 - Proximity to like properties
- Urban vs. Rural
- "Overall, the common themes revolve around the need for inclusivity, collaboration, accessible design, and regulations that promote community integra on and empowerment for individuals with developmental disabilities. The limited data highlights the importance of tailoring solutions to local contexts while keeping the broader principles of inclusive housing in mind"



- Best Practices
 - Gov, Regulatory agencies, DS agencies
- Examples
 - Gov
 - Standardize terms
 - One waitlist
 - Zoning occupancy limits ensure a minimum
 - Flexibility in unit types
 - Regulatory
 - Mandate universal design
 - Coordinate with support agencies
 - DS agencies
 - Develop resources for municipalities
 - Improve Public awareness










- Why?

 - Learn about our state of readiness, identify barriers, make recommendations




- How?
 - Via an online survey to OASIS member agencies






- What did it ask?

 - What are the challenges






- Those Ready to Build said
 - Land available, owned
 - Partners in place, community support
 - Access to resources, funds, reserve and gov support






- Those NOT Ready to Build said
 - Financial Constraints
 - Access to Land / Property
 - Capacity for Planning, lacking
 - Inflation of Costs






- Results
 - 77 responded
 - At least 25% of respondents were ready
 - 26 of them prepared to commence construction
 - 60 respondents reported lack of funding.
 - Information broken down by region






- Recommendations
 - Streamline the pathway to funding
 - Provide organizations technical assistance
 - Facilitate partnerships and collaborations
 - Board engagement
 - Regulation reform
 - Promote community-based models
 - Provide long term funding commitments





- Recommendations
 - More research needed!
